Our FS1 children enjoyed an exciting visit to Spinneys, where they explored the supermarket environment, looked at different types of food, and helped with a class shopping list. The trip gave them the chance to observe how food is organised, where items come from, and who works in the shop. The children were curious and confident, taking turns to lead the group and ask questions, making it a meaningful and memorable real-world experience.

FS1 School Bus Washing Event – Taking Pride in Our School Community





Travelling in 4x4s across the dunes, the children explored the local landscape and observed desert wildlife in its natural habitat. They also engaged with conservation displays that highlighted the importance of protecting the UAE's unique environment and cultural heritage.

Tudor House Project – Great Fire of London

As part of their termly question "Did the Great Fire make London a better or worse place?", Year 2 designed, built, and then safely burned their own model Tudor houses to recreate the events of the Great Fire of London. This handson project allowed children to explore how and why the fire spread so quickly, using their knowledge of historical events and materials in science.

SMSC: Fostered reflection on the impact of historical events on communities and how people responded to disaster and change.

British Values: Explored the historical context of the rule of law and how responses to the fire led to lasting changes in building regulations.




