## MISSION

This policy is applied at MTW alongside our school's vision, mission and values. Alongside the principles of High-Performance Learning; VAA and A.C.P. characteristics.

## Objective:

Sensory or Messy play is used to plan for appropriate experinces that meet the needs of the curriculum. It is used to plan activities that help to develop children's creative and sensory skills and to allow children to explore using all of their senses. Sensory play allows children to experiment and explore different properties of materials and how they change over time.

## Implementation:

> Teachers plan messy play activities that are age appropriate and are linked to the progression of skills.
> Teachers risk assess and secure safety at all times (hand washing, protective clothing, supervision, water play, overnight storage or disposal)
> Children are not encouraged to put the play equipment in their mouth and if they do so they are thoroughly cleaned.
> At MTW we use a variety of resources for play such as; sand, water, slime, playdough, glupe, water balls, pasta play, paint, flour with water.
> Within our Forest Schools/Farm curriculum students will also dig in soil, role play in mud kitchens and use a range of other sensory items.
> Adults are not permitted to plan activities that include flour or cornflour without water_(inhalation and choke hazard).
> Water activities that are planned, should be usually outside, to prevent slippery and wet floors in the classroom and be fully risk assessed
> Sensory play should be cross curricular and enhance the learning of all other areas of the curriculum in safe ways.

## Monitoring and review

This policy is monitored by MTW Senior Leaders and will be reviewed every three years or earlier if necessary.
