UAE Climate-Responsible Companies Pledge

Deeply concerned with the serious threat of climate change and its adverse impacts on biodiversity, oceans, soil and land, food security, water security, public health, and biosecurity, and its role in increasing the frequency, scale, and duration of extreme weather conditions that affect people's wellbeing and the health of the planet,

Emphasizing the importance of solidarity and partnerships in facing this global challenge and committing to supporting the objectives of the Paris Agreement of limiting global warming to well below 2°C, preferably 1.5°C, compared to pre-industrial levels, and achieving climate neutrality by mid-century,

Responding to the call of the Glasgow Climate Pact, an outcome of the 26th UN Climate Change Conference (COP26), for member countries of the UN Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) to increase the ambitions of their Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs) and seek higher greenhouse gas (GHG) emission reduction targets for 2030,

Realizing the paramount role of the triple helix in implementing the UAE Net Zero by 2050 Strategic Initiative through facilitating access to finance, strengthening the contribution of all actors to the net-zero drive, and accelerating the development and adoption of competitive and sustainable climate-smart technologies and innovations,

We, as climate-conscious and responsible private sector companies based in the UAE,

Commit to stepping up our collective efforts to combat climate change by:

I Measuring and reporting our GHG emissions in a transparent manner, developing measurable plans in line with national sectoral climate targets to reduce our carbon footprint, and sharing these plans with the UAE government to contribute to achieving the

national net-zero target by 2050 or earlier;

Factoring in climate change mitigation and adaptation measures as core principles of our businesses and operational models;

We understand that every child is unique, and their individual circumstances may influence the extent to which they can take on these challenges. The purpose is to encourage participation and growth, and we want to ensure that your child's engagement is both enjoyable and manageable.

Recyclable Art: Create artwork using only recyclable materials, such as cardboard, paper, or plastic bottles.

Plant a Seed: Plant and care for a small vegetable or flower garden, learning about the importance of nurturing plants. You could use the MTW planatable pencils.

Reduce, Reuse, Recycle: Learn about the three R's (Reduce, Reuse, Recycle) and nd creative ways to implement them at home.

Sustainable Crafts: Make eco-friendly crafts using natural materials like twigs, seashells or leaves.

Entrepreneurial Spirit: Encourage children to come up with a small business idea, such as a lemonade stand or a homemade craft sale.

Donate and Give: Collect gently used toys, clothes, or books to donate to a local charity or shelter.

Random Acts of Kindness: Perform small acts of kindness, such as writing thank-you notes or helping someone in need.

Team Building Challenge: Engage in team-building activities that promote leadership, cooperation, and problem-solving. (To build the tallest Marshmallow Tower using only Marshmallows and Toothpicks https://youtu.be/c-1fd7NaQBw)

Book Club: Start a summer reading club with friends, choosing books that focus on sustainability or promote positive values.

Family Cooking: Plan and prepare a sustainable meal using locally sourced ingredients and reduce food waste.

Fun with Science: Conduct simple science experiments that teach children about sustainability and environmental concepts. (Example here: https://www.smorescience.com/water-cycle-in-a-bag-experiment/)

DIY Bird Feeder: Build a bird feeder using recycled materials and observe different bird species in your area.

Cultural Discovery: Prepare a list of countries or regions from around the world, each representing a different culture or tradition. Write the names of these countries/regions on individual index cards or slips of paper.

Energy Detective: Identify ways to conserve energy at home, such as turning off lights when not needed or unplugging electronics.

Creative Storytelling: Encourage children to write or illustrate their own stories that promote kindness, respect, or sustainability.

Puppet Show: Create puppets from recycled materials and put on a puppet show with a positive message.

Sustainable Fashion: Organise a fashion show using clothes made from recycled materials or organise a clothes swap event with your family or friends.

Mindfulness and Meditation: Teach children techniques for mindfulness and meditation to promote self-confidence and relaxation.

Practice yoga poses, promoting physical and mental well-being.

Gratitude Jar: Decorate a jar and encourage family or friends to write down things they are grateful for each day.

Creative Recycling Bins: Decorate recycling bins for different materials and place them strategically in your home.

Respect for Wildlife: Learn about local wildlife and their habitats and discuss ways to respect and protect them.

DIY Natural Cleaners: Teach children to make natural cleaning solutions using ingredients like vinegar and baking soda.

Entrepreneurship: Offer your natural cleaning products for sale to family and friends.

Refection and Celebration: Reflect on the summer challenge experience, discuss what was learned, and celebrate accomplishments with a small gathering.
