The trip supported their learning about national identity, traditions, and the importance of preserving cultural heritage.











Year I had an exciting adventure exploring Dubai aboard the City Sightseeing Bus. The children enjoyed spotting famous landmarks such as the Burj Khalifa, Burj Al Arab and Dubai Frame. They learned fascinating facts about the city's history and culture while taking in the sights from the open-top bus.









The school hosted **Space Week – Living in Space** to inspire curiosity, creativity, and cross-curricular learning from FS to Year 6. The week featured hands-on experiments, visiting experiences, and themed house events that brought science to life. Pupils took part in STEM investigations, creative art projects, and curriculum-linked activities designed to extend their knowledge and skills. Assemblies and challenges encouraged teamwork and celebrated scientific enquiry, while outdoor experiences allowed children to explore big questions about life beyond Earth.

This thematic approach enriched the curriculum, sparked imagination, and promoted collaboration, while strengthening pupils' understanding of science, exploration, and aspiration.





Year 6 enjoyed an action-packed day of hands-on discovery at the Sharjah Natural History and Botanical Museum, the Wildlife Museum, and the Children's Farm. From examining ancient fossils and native plants to observing wildlife and interacting with farm animals, pupils were immersed in nature and science beyond the classroom. It was a fantastic opportunity to explore real-world links to their learning, with teamwork, curiosity, and plenty of excitement throughout the day.









As part of exploring the big question "Who are we at GEMS Metropole?", FSI children took part in washing the school buses. This experience helped them to understand the importance of leadership and community, as they worked together to take responsibility for their shared environment. Through teamwork and cooperation, the children demonstrated that being part of GEMS Metropole means showing curiosity, confidence, creativity, respect, and kindness in all that we do.









Year 3 had a brilliant visit to the Saruq Al-Hadid Archaeology Museum. The children explored real artefacts, including pottery, tools, and metalwork, and learned how archaeologists uncover clues from the past. They particularly enjoyed the interactive exhibits and asked fantastic questions throughout the tour.

The trip helped deepen their understanding of ancient civilisations and linked perfectly to their learning in History and Geography. The students returned to school excited to share what they had discovered and ready to build on this knowledge in class.









Year 2 were excited to welcome the Dubai Civil Defence Fire Service to school. The children explored the fire engine, saw real equipment in action, and learned important fire safety facts.

The visit linked perfectly to our Great Fire of London topic and gave the students a brilliant opportunity to meet real-life heroes in our community.
