# Primary ECAs

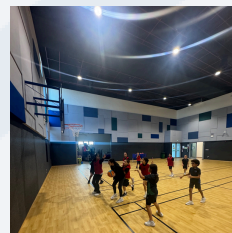
## Y3 & Y4 Basketball:
